

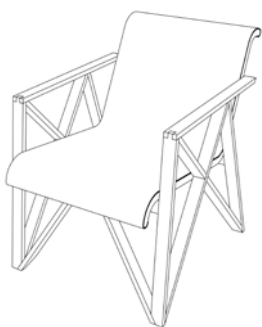
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Armchair for Metz&Co

Frame:

Solid oak or American walnut with transparent lacquer.

Seat:

Foam moulded springs upholstered with a selection of plain fabrics and leathers. Customer's own material can not be accepted.



Gerrit Rietveld designed this Arm chair in 1942 for Metz&Co, a leading Amsterdam based department store for fashion and design in 20th century. However it was never produced because of the Second World War. The prototypes always stayed in the collection of the "Stedelijk Museum" in Amsterdam. The first series of the Arm chair for Metz&Co was produced in 2017.



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
